The characterful and aromatic 2017 Katalin Iturzaeta could be in a sweet spot and feels perfect for current drinking. Having kept the dissolved gas, the cork pops easily, and the wine has developed more nuance and aromas, revealing a golden color with some honeyed notes and a vibrant palate with citrus freshness. It's tasty, fairly light, ethereal, clean and very easy to drink, finishing dry and with a salty/stony feeling. 3,500 bottles produced. It was bottled in June 2018.

Jokin Aranzábal is the great-grandson of Katalin Iturzaeta, and he produces a single cuvée of a very traditional Txakoli from Getaria from 0.6 hectares of vines, most of them centenary, with some dissolved gas and is presented in a classical Rhin bottle. Production varies between 2,500 and 4,000 bottles, depending on the vintage. He doesn't export to the US, but his wine can be found in Toronto, Canada.
